Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

IN METRO EAST'S MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT) PROGRAM, THE COUNSELOR'S PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY IS TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT AND SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT FOR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

- 1. **CONDUCT ASSESSMENTS:** CONDUCT THOROUGH ASSESSMENTS OF INDIVIDUALS SEEKING MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT, INCLUDING THEIR SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL, AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS THAT MAY CONTRIBUTE TO THEIR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER. ASSESS THEIR READINESS FOR TREATMENT AND IDENTIFY THEIR SPECIFIC NEEDS.
- 2. TREATMENT PLANNING: COLLABORATE WITH THE TREATMENT TEAM, INCLUDING PHYSICIANS, NURSES, AND COUNSELORS, TO DEVELOP INDIVIDUALIZED TREATMENT PLANS FOR EACH CLIENT. IDENTIFY GOALS AND OBJECTIVES THAT ADDRESS THEIR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER AND SUPPORT THEIR OVERALL WELL-BEING.
- 3. **INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING:** PROVIDE INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING TO CLIENTS, USING EVIDENCE-BASED THERAPEUTIC APPROACHES, TO ADDRESS THE UNDERLYING ISSUES RELATED TO THEIR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER. HELP CLIENTS DEVELOP COPING SKILLS, MANAGE CRAVINGS, AND MAKE POSITIVE CHANGES IN THEIR LIVES.

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- **4. GROUP THERAPY:** FACILITATE GROUP THERAPY SESSIONS TO SUPPORT CLIENTS IN THEIR RECOVERY JOURNEY.

 CREATE A SAFE AND SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT WHERE CLIENTS CAN SHARE THEIR EXPERIENCES, LEARN FROM OTHERS, AND DEVELOP HEALTHY COPING STRATEGIES.
- **5. CASE MANAGEMENT:** COORDINATE AND ADVOCATE FOR CLIENTS' ACCESS TO VARIOUS RESOURCES AND SERVICES, SUCH AS HOUSING, EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE, HEALTHCARE, AND LEGAL SUPPORT. HELP CLIENTS NAVIGATE THE SYSTEM AND CONNECT WITH APPROPRIATE COMMUNITY RESOURCES.
- 6. **EDUCATION AND SUPPORT:** PROVIDE EDUCATION TO CLIENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES ABOUT MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT, ADDICTION, RELAPSE PREVENTION, AND OTHER RELEVANT TOPICS. OFFER ONGOING SUPPORT TO CLIENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES, ADDRESSING THEIR CONCERNS AND PROVIDING GUIDANCE THROUGHOUT THE TREATMENT PROCESS.
- 7. **DOCUMENTATION AND REPORTING:** MAINTAIN ACCURATE AND UP-TO-DATE CLIENT RECORDS, INCLUDING ASSESSMENTS, TREATMENT PLANS, PROGRESS NOTES, AND DISCHARGE SUMMARIES. ADHERE TO ALL LEGAL AND ETHICAL STANDARDS REGARDING CLIENT CONFIDENTIALITY AND RECORD KEEPING.
- 8. **COLLABORATION AND CONSULTATION:** COLLABORATE WITH OTHER PROFESSIONALS WITHIN THE MAT PROGRAM, SUCH AS PHYSICIANS, NURSES, AND COUNSELORS, TO ENSURE INTEGRATED CARE. CONSULT WITH THE TREATMENT TEAM TO ADDRESS ANY CONCERNS, MODIFY TREATMENT PLANS, AND PROVIDE INPUT ON CLIENTS' PROGRESS.
- **9. CARE COORDINATION AND REFERRAL:** ENSURE EFFORTS TO CREATE ACTIVE COMMUNICATION CHANNELS WITH OTHER SERVICE PROVIDERS IS DOCUMENTED AND APPROPRIATE REFERRALS ARE MADE AND FOLLOWED-UP.

- Experience working in substance abuse or addiction treatment settings, preferably with a focus on medication-assisted treatment.
- **Demonstrated experience** conducting individual and group counseling sessions, developing treatment plans, and providing ongoing support and monitoring to clients.
- **Familiarity with the recovery process** and understanding of the challenges faced by individuals with substance use disorders.
- Understanding of pharmacology related to addiction and the effects of medication used in MAT.
- Strong assessment and diagnostic skills to evaluate clients' needs and determine appropriate treatment plans.
- **Excellent communication and interpersonal skills** to build rapport with clients and collaborate effectively with a multidisciplinary treatment team.
- Cultural sensitivity and the ability to work with diverse populations.
- Familiarity with relevant ethical and legal considerations in addiction counseling.
- Active engagement in required Detroit Wayne Connect, Improving My Practices and continuing training and education and staying up-to-date with advancements in addiction treatment and medication-assisted therapies.
